Paisano has always been important in my life. I was in fifth grade when my father became pastor in Monahans. Every year we attended general encampment staying in the Monahans pastor's cabin. Mom always sprinkled Epsom Salt around our bunks to discourage mice. There were no refrigerators, and we used communal bathrooms and showers.

On Sundays, area pastors taught Sunday school in different pavilions. Of course, they really preached. I remember outstanding preachers and Bible teachers. If the sermons were boring, I gazed at the incredible tabernacle ceiling in wonder that no poles held up the roof.

I first noticed girls at Paisano and experienced my first "love." People said it was puppy love, but she was the daughter of a pastor from El Paso. I had many friends

from the area because of Paisano.

I was always in awe of Mr. Kokernot—the one older folks called "Herbert"—many of the other ranchers and the platform preachers and teachers. I feared Kay Mitchell and Mrs. W. R. White (Catherine).

I attended RA and music camps and later worked for Mrs. Johnson on the cooking team. One of us got up at 4:00 a.m. to start fires in the wood stoves. Those were some of the best days of my life.

In college, I kept coming back to Paisano, and in 1961 or 1962 was general encampment's first "Youth Minister." Of course, youth ministry wasn't like today. I will never forget the thrill when Glenn Edwards asked me to be a Paisano preacher.

Like many of you, Paisano is in my blood. The encampment has left an indelible mark on my life. For that, I am eternally grateful. I am also thankful for the joy of being President.

But I believe Paisano's best years are yet to come. "For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the LORD, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." That is my prayer for Paisano and for each of you.

God moves through the generous gifts from our Paisano Family. This year, contributions exceeded budget by \$58,000 while expenses were \$18,000 over budget. Additionally, we received a memorial gift designated for roads.

The current year is also going well. At the half-way point Sources of Funds are 28% of budget while Uses of Funds are 58% of budget. These percentages are normal since most of our receipts come during the encampment. Thank you for your continued support of Paisano.
